

Quantifiers: Few, Little

FORM:

FEW	LITTLE
------------	---------------

USE:

Both of these words describe a relatively small quantity of something.
“**Few**” is used to describe a small quantity of something that can be counted.
“**Little**” is used to describe a small quantity of something that cannot be counted.

EXAMPLES:

Few days go by as quickly as today has.
Little time passed before she called us back.
