FORM:

NO ONE NOBODY EVERYONE EVERYBODY

USE:

“Everyone” and “everybody” mean that all people in a group are present or acting in a particular situation. All these words are conjugated as singular.

EXAMPLES:

I arrived at the office early, and no one was there.
Nobody knows the password to Mary’s computer.
It was nine o’clock before everyone arrived.
Let’s have chicken for supper. Everybody loves it.
