

Nouns: Nothing, No One

FORM:

NOTHING NO ONE

USE:

“**Nothing**” is used to demonstrate that no thing is present. It is the equivalent of “**not ... anything**”. “**No one**” is similar, but for people. It is the equivalent of “**not ... anyone or not ... anybody**”.

EXAMPLES:

*The conference room is empty. There is no one there.
She wasn't hungry. She ate nothing for supper.*
