Modals: Review by Use

USE: Modals auxiliary verbs are widely used in English in a variety of communicative functions. Some modals can be used for more than one communicative function. Here is an overview of the different communicative functions and the modals that are used in those situations.

• To express ability I <u>can</u> speak French. I <u>am able to</u> speak French.

• To express obligation

You <u>ought to</u> thank your grandparents for the present. You <u>have to</u> thank your grandparents for the present.

• **To express necessity** *You must get your passport renewed.*

You <u>have to</u> get your passport renewed.

• To express possibility

It <u>could</u> snow tomorrow. It <u>might</u> snow tomorrow. It <u>may</u> snow tomorrow.

• To speculate

Her coffee is still warm. She <u>must</u> have just left. Her coffee is still warm. She <u>could</u> have just left. Her coffee is still warm. She <u>might</u> have just left. Her coffee is still warm. She <u>may</u> have just left.

• To predict

They left two hours ago. They should arrive soon.

• To express disapproval

You <u>should have</u> called before you came over! You <u>could have</u> called before you came over!

• To request

<u>Can</u> you open the door for me? <u>Would</u> you open the door for me?

• To offer <u>Would</u> you like a coffee? <u>May</u> I get you a coffee? <u>Can</u> I get you a coffee?

• To ask for or grant permission <u>Can</u> I use your bathroom? <u>May</u> I use your bathroom? You <u>can</u> use the bathroom upstairs. You <u>may</u> use the bathroom upstairs.

• To advise

You <u>ought to</u> call your parents. You <u>should</u> call your parents. You <u>had better</u> call your parents.

• **To suggest** *You <u>could</u> buy the dress first and then buy the jacket later.*

• To invite

Would you like to go to the movies tonight?
