

## Quantifiers: Negative

**FORM:** Negative quantifiers tell us that the number or amount of something is insufficient. Negative quantifiers already have a negative meaning, so we do not make negative sentences with them. We also do not make questions with them. Some of the quantifiers go with count nouns, some go with non-count nouns and some go with both. They are listed below.

### Count Nouns

*Not all/not every*  
*Not many*  
*Few*  
*Hardly any*  
*Almost no/none*  
*No/none/not any*

### Non-Count Nouns

*not all*  
*not much*  
*little*  
*hardly any*  
*almost no/none*  
*no/none/not any*

### Examples:

***Not all** Canadians speak English.*  
*There is **hardly any** candy left in the jar.*  
*There **isn't any** milk in the fridge.*
