USE:	"As" is used for comparisons when two people or things are equal. Both adjectives and adverbs can be used between (not) asas . They can be preceded by just , and they can be preceded by (not) nearly or almost to denote a small difference in the comparison.			
EXAMPLES:	BMW:\$40,000A BMW is as expensive as a Mercedes.Mercedes:\$40,000A Mercedes is almost as expensive as a Jaguar.Jaguar:\$45,000A Jaguar is not nearly as expensive as a Rolls Royce.Rolls Royce:\$200,000
