## Discourse Markers: Sequencing, Adding and Linking

Linking	
These markers usuall	y appear at the beginning of a sentence:
Sequencing Markers	<ul> <li>s: - used to indicate the number of points being made (more common in writing)</li> <li>Ex. first, second, third etc.; firstly, secondly etc.; first of all, to start, finally, last, lastly</li> <li>- used to show the order of events</li> <li>Ex. then, next, later, afterwards</li> </ul>
Adding Markers:	- used to add information to what has been already expressed <u>Ex.</u> also (use before new information), too (use after new information), moreover, furthermore, further, in addition
Linking Markers:	- to indicate information that is similar to previous information <i>Ex. similarly</i> , <i>likewise</i>
