go sailing

go running
go skating
go swimming

go skiing
go shopping
go fishing

USE:

The form **go + gerund** is used to form idiomatic expressions for certain activities. Most of these activities are related to leisure.

EXAMPLES:

I like to go shopping on Saturday morning.
David often goes camping in the summer.
Would you like to go skating today?
We don't go running when it rains.
