## Future: Perfect, Perfect Progressive

FORM:

| FUTURE PERFECT | will have + PAST PARTICIPLE |

| FUTURE PERFECT | will have been + PRESENT PARTICIPLE |

FUTURE PERFECT will have + PAST PARTICIPLE
FUTURE PERFECT PROGRESSIVE

The future perfect is used for actions finished before, by the time, or by and a future time. It sometimes uses in or within and a future duration.

EXAMPLES: I will have written the test before Monday.
I will have bought a house by 2009. (by means before and including) By the time I retire, I will have made millions

USE: The future perfect progressive is used for actions in progress at a future time. Unlike the future progressive, we know when the action started. Compare the following:

EXAMPLES: I will have been sleeping for two hours by midnight.
I will have been teaching for ten years this April.
Notice also that the future perfect progressive uses the same prepositions as the future perfect but also needs for to indicate duration.

If you visit the farm in October, the workers will have been harvesting the crops for two weeks.
