FORM:	FUTURE PERFECT	will have + PAST PARTICIPLE		
	FUTURE PERFECT PROGRESSIVE	will have been + PRESENT PARTICIPLE		
USE	The future perfect is used for actions finished <i>before</i> , <i>by the time</i> , or <i>by</i> and a future time. It sometimes uses <i>in</i> or <i>within</i> and a future duration.			
EXAMPLES:	I <u>will have written</u> the test before Monday. I <u>will have bought</u> a house by 2009. (by means before and including) By the time I retire, I <u>will have made</u> millions			
USE:	The future perfect progressive is used for actions in progress at a future time. Unlike the future progressive, we know when the action started. Compare the following:			
EXAMPLES:	I <u>will have been sleeping f</u> or two hours by midnight. I <u>will have been teaching</u> for ten years this April.			
	Notice also that the future perfect progressive uses the same prepositions as the future perfect but also needs <i>for</i> to indicate duration.			
	If you visit the farm in October, the workers <u>will have been harvesting</u> the crops <u>for</u> two weeks.
