Passive Voice: Complex Passives

FORM

It + passive + *that* clause

or

Subject + passive + *to* infinitive clause

(other than It)

USE

The **complex passive** is used in formal written or spoken English. It can be used to create an impersonal tone and to express information that has not been verified as true. The **complex passive** can also be used to express past beliefs that are not seen as true now, or general expectations about the future. The "*IT*"+ *passive* form is often used to introduce a topic because new information appears at the end of the sentence. The "*passive* + *to infinitive*" form is often used when the subject is known from a previous mention. The infinitive in the independent clause must be perfective if the event in the clause occurred in the past and the main clause is in the present tense.(*Example 2*)

EXAMPLES

To form the second type of complex passive: change the subject of the *that* clause ("**all students**") to the subject of the main clause. The verb may have to change to agree with the subject. The *that* clause changes to an infinitive clause.

1. It <u>is expected</u> that **all students complete** assignments on time. (singular verb)

All students are expected to complete assignments on time.

(plural verb)

2. It <u>is known</u> that **British soldiers played** an early form of ice hockey in Canada. (singular verb)

British soldiers are known to have played an early form of ice hockey in Canada.

(plural verb) (perfective verb)
