Subject: Subject – Verb Agreement

Outlined below are some Subject – Verb Agreement rules dealing with expressions of quantity.

- 1. The verb is determined by the noun that follows "of" in most expressions of quantity.
 - Ex. A section of the building is not insulated.

 Two-thirds of the money is mine.

 A bunch of my buddies are forming a soccer team.

 Some of the books are used.
- 2. One of, each of, and every one of take singular verbs.
 - Ex. One of my grammar books has been stolen. Each of the teachers is here.
- 3. Subjects with <u>none of</u> are considered singular in formal English even though the noun is plural. *Ex. None of the boys* **lives** *here now*.
- 4. <u>A number of</u> is an expression of quantity meaning 'a lot of'. It is followed by a plural noun and a plural verb. <u>The number of</u> is the subject and is followed by a singular verb.
 - Ex. A number of complaints are made everyday about your poor attitude. The number of students in the class is ten.
