## The Order of Modifiers

FORM:

> Modifiers are words that we add before a noun to provide more information and to make a noun phrase. Modifiers can be determiners (quantifiers, articles, possessive pronouns, demonstratives), intensifiers, adjectives or other nouns.

USE: $\quad$ There is an order in which the modifiers are placed according to their category. You usually only use one determiner within a noun phrase.

Quantifiers Articles Possessive Demonstrative Intensifiers Adjectives Nouns Pronouns Pronouns

Examples:

- I need some really good ideas for this project.
- It was a wonderful spring day.

A noun can be modified by more than one adjective. We don't usually use more than two or three adjectives at the most. Some of the groups of adjectives can be grouped into adjectives of appearance and adjectives of origin. Below is the usual word order of adjectives. Adjectives are never plural in English.

Opinion/ Evaluation attractive special
