

## Complements: Adjective Object Complement

**FORM:**

**subject + verb + object + adjective complement**

**USE:**

**Adjective Object Complements** describe beliefs, opinions, feelings or observations about the object. Common verbs used with adjective object complements: *consider, call, find, discover, imagine, prove, think, make*.

**EXAMPLES:**

*The university considered the test results accurate.*

*I find theories about life on other planets unbelievable.*

*Big groups of people make Jane nervous.*

*Jack found his stolen briefcase empty in a parking lot near his office.*
