## **Complements: Adjective Object Complement**

FORM:

subject + verb + object + adjective complement

**USE:** Adjective Object Complements describe beliefs, opinions, feelings or

observations about the object. Common verbs used with adjective object complements: *consider*, *call*, *find*, *discover*, *imagine*, *prove*, *think*, *make*.

**EXAMPLES:** The university considered the test results accurate.

*I find theories about life on other planets unbelievable.* 

Big groups of people make Jane nervous.

Jack found his stolen briefcase empty in a parking lot near his office.
