USE: $\quad$ Sentences with subjunctive verbs and nouns generally stress importance or urgency. It shows that the speaker wants something to happen. Since it isn't certain that something will happen, the 'uncertain' verbs are in the present subjunctive form. (same form as bare infinitive)

EXAMPLES: $\quad$ The teacher demands that we be on time for class. I insisted that he not smoke in my house.
Their suggestion that she be told the truth would upset her deeply.
