FORM:	Causatives have both an active and a passive form.
	 <u>Passive Causatives</u>: Use the past participle after the verbs 'have' and 'get' to give the causative a passive meaning (the doer of the action is understood, obvious, or unimportant, so it is not stated). When used in the passive both 'have' and 'get' share the same meaning. <i>Ex. I had the car washed.</i> (by someone) <i>I got the car washed.</i> (by someone)
	Active Causatives: Use the simple form of the verb, not an infinitive, after 'make,' 'have,' and 'let''. With the active causative, the doer of the action is stated. The verb 'make' means that the 'causer' forces the 'doer' to perform the action. 'Have' means that the 'causer' asks the 'doer' to do something. 'Let' suggests that the 'causer' gives the 'doer' permission to act. <i>Ex. Mr. Anderson always <u>makes</u> his son <u>cut</u> the grass. <i>The teacher <u>had</u> the students <u>clean</u> her boards. Gretchen <u>lets her children stay up</u> to watch the hockey match on Saturday nights.</i></i>
	 Use a full infinitive after the verb 'get' to say that the 'causer' persuades the 'doer' to do something. Other causatives followed by the full infinitive are: allow, permit, force, cause, require, motivate, encourage and want. Ex: Rick will get his little brother to keep his secret from his parents. The manager requires employees to be on time. NOTE: 'Help' can be followed by either a full infinitive or the simple form of the verb. Ex: Could you help me lift these boxes? I helped my husband to clean the garage.
