FORM:	VERY + adjective + adverbs + quantity words		
USE:	<b>"Very"</b> is an adverb of degree. It is placed immediately BEFORE the adjectives or adverbs or quantity words which it modifies to make them stronger, but not so strong that the action doesn't stop.		
EXAMPLES:	<i>The coffee is <u>very</u> hot, but I can drink it.</i> (very + adjective) <i>He speaks <u>very</u> fast, but I can understand him.</i> (very + adverb) <i>I love him <u>very</u> much, so we will get married soon.</i> (very + quantity words)
