Adverbs:	Too, Also
FORM:	TOO ALSO
USE:	"Also" and "too" can also be adverbs used to add some additional information in <u>affirmative sentences only</u> . "Also" is placed immediately before all verbs, but after the verb "to be" . "Too" is usually placed at the end of a sentence.
EXAMPLES:	 Kathy likes coffee and she likes tea. ★ Kathy likes coffee and she <u>also</u> likes tea. ★ Kathy likes coffee and she likes tea <u>too</u>.
