

Adverbs: Too, Also

FORM:

TOO	ALSO
-----	------

USE:

“Also” and “too” can also be adverbs used to add some additional information in affirmative sentences only. “Also” is placed immediately before all verbs, but after the verb “to be”. “Too” is usually placed at the end of a sentence.

EXAMPLES:

Kathy likes coffee and she likes tea. → Kathy likes coffee and she also likes tea.
Kathy likes coffee and she likes tea. → Kathy likes coffee and she likes tea too.
