USE: The Simple Present tense is used:

- To talk about habits and routines: I get up early and read the paper.
- To make statements about things that happen or are generally true: The sun rises in the east.
- With frequency expressions. They tell how often we do something. They can come at the end or at the beginning of a sentence. I go on vacation once a year. Common frequency expressions are: every morning, every day, every winter, all the time, once a week.
- With time expressions. They tell when we do something. They usually come at the end of a sentence. I visit my grandmother on the weekend. Examples of time expressions are: in the morning, in May, in 1998, in the summer, at 10:00, at night, on Monday, on June $20^{\text {th }}$, on the weekend.
