

## Simple Past: Pronunciation Review

With past tense regular verbs, the “ed” can sound like: “t” – verbs that end in a non-voiced sound in simple form; “d” – verbs that end in a vowel or voiced sound in simple form; or “id” – verbs that end in a t /d sound in simple form.

Examples: “t” sound: *touch – touched*

“d” sound: *play – played, learn – learned*

“id” sound: *start – started, depend – depended*
