## Count and Non-Count Nouns: Overview

## Count Nouns

- can be singular or plural
- used with singular or plural verbs


## Non-Count Nouns

- have only one form, with no "s" or "-es" endings
- used with singular verbs

Some non-count nouns can be used as count nouns when we talk about the whole object, not part of an object.
Examples: I ate chicken for dinner last night. (non-count)
The farmer has four chickens. (count)
The children are eating cake. (non-count)
I bought two cakes, one chocolate and one vanilla. (plural count)
Maria made a cake for Jim's birthday. (singular count)
Non-count nouns do not have plural forms. To express the number of a non-count noun we can use units of measure. The unit of measure can be the container, amount or shape of the non-count noun. We don’t put "s" or "-es" on non-count nouns with units of measure.
Form: unit of measure + of + non-count noun
Examples: There are two bottles of wine on the table. (container)
I need two kilograms of cheese. (amount)
Kim ate two slices of pizza. (shape)
