Quantifiers: Some, Any **FORM: SOME ANY** "Some" and "any" are unspecific quantities of plural / non-count nouns only. **USE:** "Some" is used in affirmative sentences and in questions when you expect "ves" as an answer. Example: I have some money. Do you want some money? "Any" is used in negative sentences and in questions when you don't know what the answer will be. Example: I don't have any money. Do you want any children? (You know Jean keeps shoe boxes under the bed. You expect "yes" as an answer.) **EXAMPLES:** Jean, do you have some boxes? Yes, I have some under the bed. (You don't know Kevin's habits. No expectations.) *Kevin, do you have any Kleenex?* Yes, I have some. No, I don't have any.
