USE:	"No" is a quantity word of "zero" used before non-count and plural nouns or sometimes it must be placed before any adjectives which are describing those nouns. It's the same as an <b>adjective</b> because it describes the noun. "Not" is used to change the verb to negative. It is an <b>adverb</b> . Sometimes, it's used before quantity words like: much, many, once, twice, enough, etc. and acts like an adjective.	
	Ex. (Aff.): Many students came yesterday.  (Neg.): Many students didn't come yesterday.	
	Not many students came yesterday.  (Zero)(Aff): No students came yesterday.
