FORM: There is no + (non-count nouns)

There are no + (plural nouns)

USE: "No" is a 'zero' quantity of a noun. When it is combined with "There is no" and

"There are no" it is used to show that there is a zero quantity of the noun in the

place stated.

EXAMPLES: There is no <u>sugar</u> in the cupboard.
