

Quantifiers: There is no, There are no

FORM: **There is no + (non-count nouns)**

There are no + (plural nouns)

USE: “No” is a ‘zero’ quantity of a noun. When it is combined with “**There is no**” and “**There are no**” it is used to show that there is a zero quantity of the noun in the place stated.

EXAMPLES: **There is no *sugar in the cupboard.***
