

## Future Simple: Will – Affirmative and Negative Forms

**FORM:**

Affirmative:	
I will	I'll
You will	You'll
She will	She'll
He will	He'll
It will	It'll
We will	We'll
You will	You'll
They will	They'll

Negative:	
I will not	I won't
You will not	You won't
She will not	She won't
He will not	He won't
It will not	It won't
We will not	We won't
You will not	You won't
They will not	They won't

**subject + will + base verb**

**subject + will + not + base verb**

The verb after **will** is always in the base verb form. It is never conjugated.

**USE:**

Use **will** for general facts about the future.

E.g. The teachers **will meet** at 2:00 p.m.

Use **will** for the future when you make a decision at that very moment; not before.

E.g. The phone is ringing. You are near the phone.

You say, "I **will get** it."

Use **will** with "probably" for the future to say that something is not definite.

E.g. She **will probably visit** us in September.

**EXAMPLES:**

*They will be here next month.*

*He won't clean his room.*
