USE:	 Use will for general facts about the future. E.g. The teachers will meet at 2:00 p.m. Use will for the future when you make a decision at that very moment; not before. E.g. The phone is ringing. You are near the phone. You say, "I will get it." Use will with "probably" for the future to say that something is not definite. E.g. She will probably visit us in September. 			
EXAMPLES:	They <u>will be</u> here next month. He <u>won't clean</u> his room.
