

Relative Pronouns: Who/Which

FORM:

Person + who
Thing + which

USE:

Who and **which** are relative pronouns. They refer to a noun or pronoun which comes before. They also join two clauses. (A clause is a subject + verb.)

Who refers to people. **Which** refers to things.

EXAMPLES:

*My friend, **who** is English, speaks several languages.*
*The table **which** broke was expensive.*
