FORM:	TO + verb
	FOR + noun
USE:	To and for can be used to introduce the reason why an action is done. To is before a <u>verb</u> to explain why something is happening. For is before a <u>noun</u> to explain why something is happening.
EXAMPLES:	Pauline is moving to Manitoba <u>to</u> work.
	Pauline is moving to Manitoba <u>for</u> a job.
