

Expression of Purpose: To / For

FORM: **TO + verb**
 FOR + noun

USE: **To** and **for** can be used to introduce the reason why an action is done.
To is before a verb to explain why something is happening.
For is before a noun to explain why something is happening.

EXAMPLES: *Pauline is moving to Manitoba to work.*
 Pauline is moving to Manitoba for a job.
