

Future Simple: Be Going To With Who, What, Where

FORM:

Questions about the Subject:

1. **Who (person) + be (am, is, are) + going to + base verb?**
2. **What (thing) + be (am, is, are) + going to + base verb?**

Questions about the Object:

1. **Whom (person) (Who in conversation) + be (am, is, are) + going to + base verb?**
2. **What (thing) + be (am, is, are) + going to + base verb?**
3. **Where (place) + be (am, is, are) + going to + base verb?**

USE:

When **who** or **what** begins a question, it is asking about the **subject**:

E.g. **Who** is going to come to the party?
subject

John and his sister are going to come to the party.

E.g. **What** is going to happen to him?
subject

Something bad is going to happen to him.

When **whom**, **what**, or **where** begins a question about the **object**:

- you must place the verb “be” after the question word.

E.g. **Whom** is Lucy going to see in concert? (**Who** in conversational English)
object

Lucy is going to see **her favorite group** in concert.
object

- **What** is Brian going to do tomorrow?
object

Brian is going to **work on his report** tomorrow.
object

- **Where** are they going to stay?
object

They are going to stay **at my cousin’s house in Paris**.
object
