Nouns: Units of Measure

FORM: unit of measurement + of + noun

USE: Non-countable nouns do not have a plural form. To express a specific quantity of a noncount noun use a unit of measure. The unit of measure can describe the container, the amount, or the **shape** of the noun to make it more specific.

Tina cooked some Linguini. *She gave him some cheese.*

They had <u>a bottle of</u> wine. She cooked one pound of Linguini. She gave him a wedge of cheese.
