## Nouns: Units of Measure <br> FORM: unit of measurement + of + noun <br> USE: Non-countable nouns do not have a plural form. To express a specific quantity of a noncount noun use a unit of measure. The unit of measure can describe the container, the amount, or the shape of the noun to make it more specific. <br> General <br> EXAMPLES: They had some wine. <br> Tina cooked some Linguini. She gave him some cheese. <br> Specific <br> They had a bottle of wine. She cooked one pound of Linguini. She gave him a wedge of cheese.
