Expressing Agreement: Short Answers

FORM:

Agreement with positive or negative sentences can be made using very short sentences and the words **SO**, **TOO**, and **NEITHER**. The auxiliary verb in the short agreement sentence must match the auxiliary verb in the main sentence. If there is no auxiliary, use the verb **DO**.

EXAMPLES:

I am a Taurus. So am I. OR Me too.

I am not a Taurus. Neither am I. OR Me neither.

I like taking photographs. **So do** I. OR Me **too**.

I don't like taking photographs. **Neither do** I. OR Me **neither**.

Jack can play the piano well. So can I. OR Me too.

Jack can't play the piano well. Neither can I. OR Me neither.

The same patterns are true for all verb tenses.

EXAMPLES:

I was at school yesterday. **So was** I. OR Me **too**.

I wasn't at school yesterday. Neither was I. OR Me neither.

I have been to Europe. **So have** I. OR Me **too**.

I haven't been to Europe. **Neither have** I. OR Me neither.
