Conditionals: Zero, First, Second

FORM: Zero Conditional: Use the simple present tense in both clauses.

USE: Use this conditional to talk about general truths and scientific facts and to talk about habits and things that happen again and again.

EXAMPLES: If you <u>eat</u> vegetables, you <u>stay</u> healthy. If you need help, call me.

FORM: First Conditional (Real): Use the simple present tense in the "if" clause and future tense in the main clause.

USE: Use this conditional to talk about what will happen under certain conditions.

EXAMPLES: If she <u>wins</u> the game, I'<u>ll be</u> surprised.

If he <u>passes</u> his test, he's going to be happy.

FORM: Second Conditional (Unreal): use the simple past tense in the "if" clause and "would" or modals + a verb in the main clause.

USE: Use this conditional to talk about imaginary situations in the present. These situations are not true.

EXAMPLES: If I <u>had</u> time, <u>I would go</u> to the concert with you. If I <u>were</u> thirsty, I <u>would drink</u> a glass of water.
