Phrasal Verbs: Look up, Write down

FORM:

LOOK UP

WRITE DOWN

USE:

Look up has different meanings, but here we will concentrate on its meaning of looking for some information which is listed in a systematic order, such as in a phone book or dictionary.

Write down is to write a piece of information on paper.

Both of these phrasal verbs are separable.

EXAMPLES:

I don't know this word. I'll \underline{look} it \underline{up} . I $\underline{looked\ up}$ the word.

I <u>looked</u> the word (noun) <u>up</u>.

I don't want to forget the word. I'll write it down. I wrote down the word. I

wrote the word down.
