FORM:	's (singular)s' (plural)			
USE:	The apostrophe s ('s) indicates possession. It is added to the end of nouns to indicate that one noun possesses another noun. The 's is added to the end of nouns, except for <b>plural</b> nouns ending in s. Singular nouns ending in s have two possible forms:s's ors'.			
EXAMPLES:	The condo that belongs to Tammy.  The apartment that Thomas rents.  The house that belongs to our neighbours.  (2 neighbours live there.)  → Tammy's condo.  → Thomas's apartment.  → Our neighbours' house.
