Reflexive Pronouns: Overview By + reflexive pronoun FORM: by myself by ourselves mvself ourselves yourself by yourself by yourselves vourselves by herself herself himself themselves by himself by themselves by itself itself USE: "Reflexive pronouns" demonstrate that the subject of a sentence is also the object of a sentence. This means that the subject, or the person or thing who performs the action is also the object, or the person or thing who receives the impact of the action. So, in the sentence, "Ouch, I cut myself", the person who did the cutting, "I" also is the person who was cut. "Reflexive pronouns" also act to reinforce or intensify the idea that the subject is the actor in a sentence. In "John did it himself", "himself" gives extra emphasis to the idea that John did it. When "by" comes before a reflexive pronoun it means that someone did something alone, or without help. "Christine did it by herself", means that only Christine did it. **EXAMPLES:** Mary hurt herself rollerblading. Jack decided to fix the leaky pipe himself. Danny went to Paris by himself.
