## Prepositions: Following Adjectives and Past Participles

FORM:

Specific prepositions follow certain adjectives and past participles.

E.g. about, at, with, of, to, in, for

**USE:** It is impossible to explain the use of these preposition - the rules are arbitrary.

**EXAMPLES:** I'm <u>interested in</u> the history of Japan.

I'm <u>happy about</u> having a day off.
They're <u>pleased with</u> their new offices.
Paul is <u>tired of</u> living in a small apartment.

I'm <u>sorry for</u> being late. He is <u>angry at/with</u> his boss.
