FORM:	Adjective One SyllableAdjective tallComparative taller thanSuperlative the tallestOne Syllable + -y Two or morehappier thanthe tallestTwo or more syllablesexpensive less expensive thanthe most expensive the least expensive
USE:	<b>Comparative adjectives</b> show relative differences, usually between two people or things. <b>Superlative adjectives</b> show extremes of difference between three or more people or things.
EXAMPLES:	Vancouver <u>is bigger than</u> Ottawa. Montreal <u>is bigger than</u> Vancouver. Toronto is <u>the biggest</u> city in Canada.
