## **Comparatives and Superlatives: Adverbs**

**FORM:** 

Adverb carefully

Comparative more carefully than less carefully than

Superlative the most carefully the least carefully

**USE:** Adverbs modify verbs or adjectives. Adverbs often answer the

question "how" or "how often" about the verb. **MORE/LESS** + **ADVERB** + **THAN** is used for the comparative form and

**THE MOST/LEAST + ADVERB** is used for the superlative form.

**EXAMPLES:** Shawn drives more carefully than Ted.

Paul drives the most carefully of all my friends.

Lucy studied <u>less carefully than</u> Mabel.

Carrie studied the least carefully of all the students in our class..
