

Comparatives and Superlatives: Verbs

FORM:	Verb	Comparative	Superlative
	weigh	weigh more than weigh less than	weigh the most weigh the least
	eats	eats more than eats less than	eats the most eats the least

USE: Verbs can also be used with comparatives and superlatives. The verb can be in any tense, and is always placed before the comparative or superlative. For comparatives, use **VERB + MORE/LESS THAN** and for superlatives use **VERB + THE MOST/LEAST**.

EXAMPLES: *A cow weighs more than a dog.*
An elephant weighs the most.
Gold costs more than silver.
Platinum costs the most.
