

Passive Voice: With “Get”

FORM:

	GET + past participle (pp)
simple present	get + pp
simple past	got + pp
future simple	will get + pp
present perfect	have/has gotten + pp

USE:

GET passives can be used with most tenses. The **GET** passive is informal and is used in casual spoken English. It is often used to refer to unexpected events, and there is usually no “by” phrase.

EXAMPLES: *My house got broken into last night. (= My house was broken into last night.)*
