

Tag Questions: Present Perfect

FORM:

I have been ..., haven't I?
You have been..., haven't you?
She has been..., hasn't she?
He has been..., hasn't he?
It has been..., hasn't it?
We have been..., haven't we?
You have been..., haven't you?
They have been..., haven't they?

I haven't been..., have I?
You haven't been..., have you?
She hasn't been..., has she?
He hasn't been..., has he?
It hasn't been..., has it?
We haven't been..., have we?
You haven't been..., have you?
They haven't been..., have they?

USE:

If the first verb is affirmative, the verb in the tag will be negative. If the first verb is negated, the verb in the tag will be "have" or "has", followed by the appropriate pronoun. Use this sentence form to look for confirmation or agreement. **There has been...hasn't there?** is frequently used with "to be".

EXAMPLES:

Vanna has been in Europe, hasn't she?
Alex hasn't been to work today, has he?
