Present	Perfect: So Far, Up Till Now, To Date
FORM:	SO FAR UP TILL NOW TO DATE
USE:	These short phrases indicate that a situation <u>began</u> in the <u>past</u> , is <u>continuing</u> at the time_you speak, and has the <u>possibility</u> to <u>continue</u> into the future. They can be used with affirmatives, negations, and questions.
	So Far \rightarrow can be used with specific time periods. Examples: so far today so far this morning so far this week so far this hour so far this winter
	Up Till Now \rightarrow expresses the same idea as "so far", but it is not used with specific time periods.
	To Date \rightarrow since the word "date" refers to the month and the number, and is a twenty-four hour period, "to date" cannot be used when talking about specific time.
EXAMPLES:	I have written four reports <u>so far</u> this week. <u>Up till now</u> we have had no requests for the new equipment. There have been fifteen calls about the new health policy <u>to date</u> .
