## Progressive Constructions: Past Perfect Progressive

FORM:
HAD + BEEN + VERB + ING
We had been talking on the phone for only two minutes when the connection was cut.

USE:
The past perfect progressive is used to emphasize continuous action in the past, prior to a key point in the past.


There are three situations when we choose to use the past perfect progressive.

- The continuous action stops when the key action occurs.

I had been skiing for three hours when I hit a tree. (You stopped skiing after hitting the tree).

- The continuous activity continues after the key action.

I had been working for six hours before I noticed that no one else had come to work.

- The continuous action has recently finished, and there is still evidence of it. She had been sleeping. Her eyes were still puffy.
