Progressive Constructions: Was / Were Going To + Base Verb

FORM:	was / were going to + base verb + a past tense verb	
USE:	This is to indicate a change of plans. The person or people referred to when you use this structure planned to do something, but for some reason did not do it. You can state the reason why not (but), but you do not have to.	
EXAMPLES:	I was going to call you <u>, but I got too busy</u> . She was going to come to the party, <u>but she got sick</u> . Bessy was going to go to a movie, but she decided to watch television instead.
