## **Intensifiers: Very Versus Too**

**USE:** Students of English often confuse the use of **VERY** and **TOO**.

Looking at the chart from the previous exercise, we see that **VERY** is used for a large degree. It tells us there is a lot of something. **TOO** is used when there is a lot of something <u>and</u> that amount or degree is <u>more</u> than we want. It is used to indicate that something is <u>excessive</u>.

*It is* <u>very</u> *hot*. (The temperature is high. This is neither a good nor bad situation.)

*It is* <u>too</u> *hot.* (The temperature is higher than I want or like. This is a bad situation.)

**TOO** can be further modified with other intensifiers, to make it stronger or weaker. But regardless, **TOO** always indicates that we have more than we want or need.

It is <u>way</u> too hot! (The temperature is high and I <u>really</u> don't like it.)

It is a <u>bit</u> too hot. (The temperature is high. I don't like it but it is not so bad.)
